Lead Safe Cleaning Tips

- Damp mop floors and wet wipe surfaces often, including window sills.
- Use wet, disposable wipes to collect paint chips before cleaning. Bag and throw out used cleaning wipes.
- Only use a HEPA-filtered vacuum cleaner.
- Flush all used cleaning water down the toilet.
- Use a doormat and take your shoes off at the door to avoid tracking lead dust into your home.
- Do not bring lead home from work. Keep and wash work clothes separately.
- Wash your child's toys, teething toys, and pacifiers.
- Wash your child's hands and face before eating and napping.

 Soil closest to your home or garage may be contaminated by lead paint. Keep children away from these places and other bare soil in the yard.



 Learn how to plant a raised garden or container garden to avoid planting in leadcontaminated soil. Children can safely help in these types of gardens.



Wear gloves and wash up after gardening.



 After gardening, use a doormat and take your shoes off at the door to avoid tracking garden soil into your home.



 Wash all of your fresh vegetables, fruits, and herbs before eating.
